Services-

Bible, notebook, pencil, instruments and or music for specials

Clothing-

t-shirts, jeans, socks, underwear, pjs, hoodie, hat, something nice to wear to services each night, knee length shorts for recreation (for evening worship service, slacks may be worn with a nice shirt, no t-shirts)

Shoes-

Closed-toe shoes for outing
Tennis/dress/sandals/boots

Shower-

towel or two, washcloths/loofa, shampoo, soap, conditioner, face-wash

Toiletries-

toothbrush, paste, floss, mouthwash, deodorant, razor, hairbrush/comb, hair products

Camera, flashlight, watch, (phone and charger if necessary to contact parents-we will not encourage their use)

Things to Leave at home:

- tank tops, racerback or cutout styles (sleeveless shirts are allowed but must not have gaping holes, cannot show cleavage, and must be full-back / shoulder-to-shoulder)

- anything that shows what should not be seen
(appropriate undergarments must be worn at all times)

Electronics:

Please leave your entertainment devices at home. Camp is a place to get away from all the distractions and draw closer to God. Electronics can cause a distraction to you and to the group. Phones in the camper's possession should be used appropriately and responsibly for things like Bible app access, quick photos during social times or parental contact when necessary. If you need to use a device, please clear it with the camp staff prior to using it; irresponsible use will result in you being asked to turn it over to your counselor for the rest of the week.
